<b>Source of online sample</b>	Selected from previously recruited online panels of research participants to fill quotas loosely based on weighting frame and past vote
<b>Positioning of voting intention questions in questionnaire?</b>	Immediately after demographics
<b>How were undecided voters handled?</b>	Undecided respondents who answered “don’t know” were asked a leaner question which also included a “don’t know” option. Those who answered don’t know were excluded from published voting intention figures but not from the survey. 7% were thus excluded from published voting intention figures.
<b>2PP calculation method</b>	Calculated according to preference flows based on respondent allocated preferences. Respondents who indicated they would not give a preference and those who said they were undecided between Labor and Liberal/Nationals were assumed to not give a preference.
